COMMUNITY SPOTLIGHT – VILLAGE OF NORTH COLLINS

Tractor Supply to start construction in the spring



Tractor Supply Company, the nation's largest rural lifestyle retailer, is planning a new store in the Village of North Collins. The location is on Main Street (Route 62) opposite the Save-A-Lot supermarket, and the new Tractor Supply will include a 19,100± SF single-story building plus outdoor merchandise display areas. The developer is Primax Properties, LLC of Charlotte NC. The project recently was approved by the Village Board of Trustees, following public hearings before the Village Planning Board and the Village Zoning Board of Appeals.

Frank Alexander of Primax says construction is targeted for a Spring 2019 start and should be complete by early Fall. Alexander added, "We're very excited about this new Tractor Supply and I want to thank the North Collins residents for their welcome and their support. I also want to thank Mayor Vincent George, the Village Board members, and the Village staff for their professionalism and courtesy through the design and approval process."

Mayor Vincent George is thrilled about this new business moving in. "This is a tremendous addition to this Village, Town and surrounding communities, bringing jobs for 12-15 people to an area that needs them. It also provides much-needed improvement to a large Main Street property. We are confident that the increased traffic will stimulate present and future business in our Village—possibly even a gas station!" says Mayor George.

AGRIBUSINESS PARK – ANGOLA/EVANS

Erie County will develop an agribusiness industrial park at the former Angola Airport site. The Erie County Agribusiness Park will offer local and regional employment opportunities to help alleviate rural poverty that exists in southern Erie County.

The project seeks to create a 152-acre agriculture-oriented industrial park in the Southtowns for the purpose of attracting private sector investments in food processing and manufacturing. Many of the jobs created at the site will be production and distribution jobs which pay a livable wage. The Agribusiness Park will also provide a market for farmers' agricultural products, potentially providing additional farm jobs.

Through the help of the ECIDA the land needed for this project has been purchased and the construction of the Agribusiness Park is planned for the near future. As updates are available, we will keep you posted.

March 15th NYS Dry Bean Meeting & Variety Evaluation

The 2019 NYS Dry Bean Growers Meeting and Variety Evaluation will be held Friday, March 15, from 8:30 am – 12:30 pm, at Cornell AgriTech at the New York State Agricultural Experiment Station, Food Research Lab Conference Room, 665 W. North St., Geneva, NY 14456.

There will be updates on dry bean production and marketing, Western bean cutworm activity, white mold management, breeding, varieties, and the use of dry beans in school lunches. They will also review research priorities and gather suggestions for future educational programs. The second half of the program will feature evaluation of the Cornell dry bean variety trial with 56 dry bean cultivars that were canned by Furmano Foods on display for taste and visual appearance. DEC and CCA credits have been applied for.

Space is limited and pre-registration is required by March 12th. Cost is \$10 per person and includes lunch. Fourth Annual CommuniTree Steward Training Course Planned

In March 2016 with funding from the **Buffalo Green Fund**, CCE Erie, along with a number of partners, launched a five-part classroom and in-field training series to teach Buffalo area residents to care for juvenile trees. Instructors for the classes included professionals in the fields of arboriculture and biology. Representatives from the City of Buffalo Department of Parks and Recreation, Re-Tree, Wendel Companies and Buffalo Olmsted Conservancy helped to organize the training. Following the training, participants volunteered their time to assist in urban street tree planting and maintenance projects.

"This course has been the first of its kind in Western New York and is the logical next step to nurture the trees that have been planted since the devastating October 12, 2006 surprise snowstorm," stated Paul Mauer, with Re-Tree Buffalo. "The project partners are collaborating to create a well-trained volunteer corps of tree caretakers. Thousands of street and park trees were destroyed by the snowstorm and have been replaced by Re-Tree's volunteers, the City of Buffalo and the Buffalo Olmsted Parks Conservancy.

New York State Berry Growers Association and Cornell Cooperative Extension offer March Blueberry Intensive Workshops



Two day-long sessions covering a variety of growing, pest, and profitability topics

The New York State Berry Growers Association (NYSBGA) has partnered with Cornell Cooperative Extension to bring growers a pair of winter Blueberry Intensive Workshops. An in-depth look at growing and management techniques, pest and diseases, profitability tools, and more, the Blueberry Intensive Workshops will feature 10 expert speakers from Cornell University, Cornell CCE, New York State IPM, Rutgers University, and Pennsylvania State University, as well as owners of successful area farms. The workshops will be held in Ellicottville, New York on March 5, 2019, and in Millbrook, New York on March 14, 2019. The cost to attend is \$35 for current NYSBGA members and \$45 for non-members.

Growers who attend the workshops will learn about:

- Choosing and preparing a site for blueberry production
- Blueberry diseases and management strategies
- Blueberry insect pest management
- Using the NEWA blueberry pest and disease models to best advantage
- Alternative options for markets
- Using a new berry crops profitability tool
- How area farms have ensured success in their blueberry growing program
- Nutrition for blueberries
- Post-harvest handling to reduce pest damage and improve fruit quality
- Correct pruning techniques, with a live, hands-on demonstration
- Pest scouting and weed management

Attendees will also receive a resource packet of presenter handouts and other valuable information that they can refer to season after season. In addition, they will have the opportunity to ask the experts questions that are specific to their own farms.
